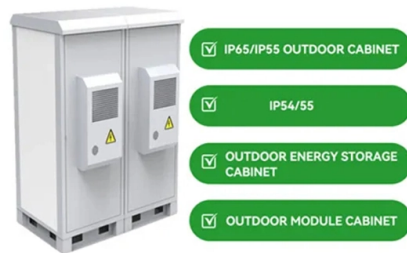


Fiber optic cable bent and sagging

Causes include excessive bending, dirty connectors, or poor splicing. Inspect and re-splice damaged sections using proper fusion splicing tools. Dirty or Damaged. Good troubleshooting is a sequence, not a scattershot of tests. Start with the simplest, fastest checks (visual inspection, cleaning, cable routing) and only move to instrumentation (power meter, VFL, OTDR) when those steps don't clear the fault. These cables consist of a core (glass or plastic) that carries light signals, surrounded by cladding to reflect light inward, a buffer for protection, and an outer jacket for durability.
